COURSE OVERVIEW

Year 1: Students explore contemporary poetry, Mary Shelley's Frankenstein, Margaret Atwood's The Handmaid's Tale, and John Webster's The Duchess of Malfi, with a focus on historical and social contexts.

Year 2: Students study Shakespeare's Othello and Christina Rossetti's poetry, and complete a 2500–3000-word essay comparing two novels, allowing for a deeper exploration of their literary interests.

An A-Level in English Literature prepares you for university courses such as English Literature and Language, Creative Writing, Journalism, Law and Theatre Studies, laying the groundwork for a range of arts degrees.
